With BBC and Sky set to ramp up their 3D-TV output over the next few years, and the British Film Institute promoting 3D as one of their priorities, now is the time for film and TV camera personnel to upskill in 3D camera.

Four Corners' *3D for Camera Professionals: creative and practical skills*, offers an intensive, 3-day training course for camera professionals, funded by Creative Skillset, the Creative Industries' Sector Skills Council, and the European Regional Development Fund. Each place has a value of over £3,000.

The course covers 3D theory, practical hands-on experience with industry-standard equipment, 3D motion control and DIT issues. Applications are welcomed from camera department professionals with significant experience in feature film or documentary.
